

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

This chapter discusses the background of the research, the scope of the research, the statement of the problem, the objectives of the research, and the significance of the research.

A. Background of the Research

The English language is important for our needs and lives. Every student is encouraged to be able to improve the quality of their education including speaking English. It is the second most spoken language in the world and most needed for business and learning needs. Globalization made the use of the English language wider and has become a language that must be learned. According to Shaleha, et al. (2016), the scavenger hunt is a game that can be played as individuals or teams to find as much information as possible in a short time. Agustine in Mamahit, et al. (2022) stated that scavenger hunt games are a fun way to practice mindfulness, social awareness, and whole-body listening skills, because these games will encourage students to express feelings and memories that must be explored, acknowledged, and defined. Scavenger hunt is a technique used in learning English that focuses on describing something real. Scavenger hunt is a technique in which students are allowed to find out what is described and can motivate students to develop and make the learning environment more alive. This strategy can be applied to reduce pressure in the learning process. Scavenger Hunt is also believed to be able to make the learning environment interactive and not boring. Whatever students say will arise based on events that students obtain during the teaching and learning process and then conclude

this information and create a perception. Furthermore, this research collects the student's perceptions of using the scavenger hunt to learn English speaking skills and also finds out students' perceptions of the learning activities they will undertake. Students' perceptions can have either positive or negative values. Perception is defined as the process of receiving, selecting, organizing, interpreting, testing, and reacting to an event in which individuals interpret the sensory information they receive by sensing stimuli through sensory organs to represent and understand their environment.
